Together, we are resisting new fossil fuel infrastructure and pushing governments, asset managers and banks to stop investing in fossil fuels, and to invest instead in the transition to a clean, just energy economy. These efforts are some of the most critical campaigns of our time. When enough people engage boldly, faithfully and powerfully, we will win.

Take Action

The current scale of the climate crisis requires a cooperative global solution that addresses the fossil fuel industry directly. As leaders across diverse religious and spiritual communities around the globe, we call on governments to urgently commence negotiations to develop and implement a Fossil Fuel Non-Proliferation Treaty, laying out a binding global plan to:



- 1. End expansion of any new coal, oil or gas production in line with the best available science as outlined by the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) and the United Nations Environment Programme;
- 2. Phase-out existing production of fossil fuels in a manner that is fair and equitable, taking into account the respective dependency of countries on fossil fuels and their capacity to transition;
- 3. Ensure a global, just transition to 100% access to renewable energy globally, support dependent economies to diversify away from fossil fuels, and enable all people and communities, not least the Global South, to flourish.
